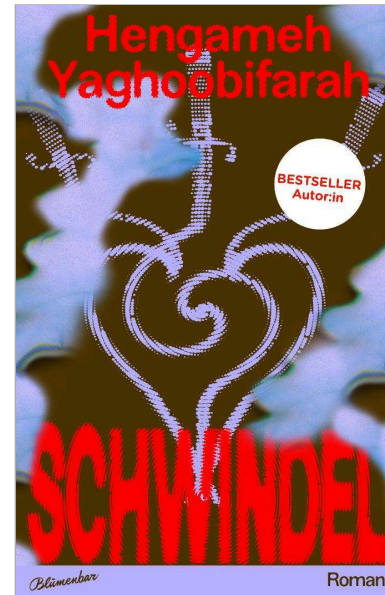
Friday evening, a high-rise building, 15th floor. Ava's date with Robin is going perfectly – until the doorbell rings and Ava's other lovers are at the door. Delia has left their cell phone in Ava's bedroom and wants to pick it up. Silvia, on the other hand, wants to confront Ava, because she's been ghosted for a week – now she finally wants to know what's really going on. The three of them meet for the first time in Ava's hallway. They knew about each other, but Ava only ever revealed the negative qualities of the other lovers to them.

Overwhelmed, Ava flees to the roof of the high-rise, and the others run after her. In their haste, no one brings keys or a cell phone – they wouldn't know who to call anyway, as the neighbors in the apartment complex are practically anonymous. So a date for two turns into a joint mission for four. The goal: to get down. But the way there is paved with conflict and revelations.

Hengameh Yaghoobifarah lives and works in Berlin. They have been a member of the editorial team at *Missy Magazine* since 2014. Between 2016 and 2022, their column *Habitus* appeared in *taz*. Together with Fatma Aydemir, Hengameh Yaghoobifarah published the highly-acclaimed essay collection *Your Homeland is Our Nightmare* in 2019. Yaghoobifarah's successful debut novel, *Ministry of Dreams*, was published in 2021.

A novel told as swiftly as Tarantino's *Kill Bill*

In Cemile Sahin's new novel *Commando Ajax*, paintings that have been missing since a sensational art heist in Boston in 1990 mysteriously reappear, including precious works by old masters such as Vermeer, Rembrandt, and Degas. By chance, they end up in the hands of Ali Hüseyin Korkmaz, a roofer and gifted amateur painter. Ali Hüseyin fled Dêrsim, Kurdistan, with his siblings after their home went up in flames. Having barely arrived in exile in Rotterdam, nothing is the same for the family after a sniper at the youngest brother's wedding settles an old score and destroys a life. What follows is a chain of events that will land one of the brothers in prison and turn their sister Fatma into a premier cleaning lady. And Ali Hüseyin will prove his talent as a painter for a spectacular painting swap.

In the style of a fast-paced action film with quick cuts, Cemile Sahin brings together the story of a Kurdish family in exile with the jet-set lifestyle of the international art world and tells of betrayal, love, and friendship funnily, wittily, and coolly – as freshly and in tune with the times as only she can.

Cemile Sahin is an author and artist and was born in Wiesbaden in 1990. She studied in London and Berlin and is the recipient of the *ars viva* prize for Visual Arts. *Taxi* was her debut novel, *All Dogs Die* her second and *Commando Ajax* her third. Cemile Sahin has been awarded the Alfred Döblin Medal for her writing. She lives in Berlin.

About loss and being lost, about the search for one's own sense of order

The boy smiles when he is afraid. He falls in love because he is sad. He is often silent, and then erupts with too much talking. He holds himself tightly together, even as an adolescent and adult.

When his father dies in an accident, the narrator's idyllic Waldorf childhood comes to an abrupt end. Now disorder reigns, also in himself, in his mind and body. He hides his grief and fear, but it will never disappear. His mother retreats, into herself and into the last corners of the increasingly chaotic house. He constantly stays with friends and develops a gifted sense of what he must do in order to be liked. And that's what he wants. He wants to be loved and admired; he wants to be a writer and belong to the high-flying cultural society of Berlin, where he moves after school. But disorder always remains in the background, growing and taking possession of him. Like a hidden current, the feelings of fear lurk within him, paralyzing him more and more until he can hardly move.

With poetic language, Simon Elson tells a true-to-life story in his debut novel of how the early death of his father drives him into a state of emotional disorder and crisis – in which thinking and feeling become indistinguishable, and he is no longer able to recognize what is good for him.

Simon Elson, born in 1980 in Hamburg, writes now and again for *Weltkunst* and *Monopol* in Berlin, but mainly books about art and artists. *Story of Disorder* is his first novel.

Frieda's case – soon launched as a major motion picture

St. Gallen, 1904: When young Frieda Keller, sentenced to death, writes her petition for clemency, the nightmare of abuse, an act of desperation and a scandalous trial lie behind her. “That’s what men do to women. They impregnate and kill them”, a friend had explained to Frieda years ago. Little did the two know at the time that this would be Frieda’s fate. She becomes pregnant after being raped. Abandoned by her father, she has to leave the village of Bischofszell, loses her employment, and has no choice but to place the baby in a children’s home. When the boy is no longer allowed to stay there and Frieda is unable to care for him, she sees no other way out than to commit a terrible act.

Michèle Minelli’s novel is based on the historical criminal case in which the dressmaker Frieda Keller was caught up in the machinations of a male-dominated justice system that placed all the blame on the woman and left the perpetrator unpunished.

Michèle Minelli, born in Zürich in 1968, is a lecturer in creative writing there. She has made documentary films, and published non-fiction books, a travelogue, and a novel before her magnificent family saga *The Restless* was published in 2012. Her novel *The Lost One* (2015) tells the authentic story of Frieda Keller, who was convicted in a sensational judicial scandal in St. Gallen in 1904. The big screen adaptation of the novel will be released in cinemas in 2024.

Lisbeth and the warrior have known each other since their training in the Armed Forces. They chose the military because they wanted a body that isn't weak — as if the only way to face the world is with a heart clenched in a fist. Many years have passed since they last saw each other, but they are still drawn to one another. They are women who have experienced violence and commit violence against themselves and those close to them. But Lisbeth and the warrior are also ready to fight against it.

The Warrior is a novel about the special friendship between two women whose top priority is to strip themselves of all vulnerability. Helene Bukowski tells of the resulting wounds, the violence, their traces and the trauma – both experienced and inherited.

Helene Bukowski, born in Berlin in 1993, once more lives in her city of birth. She studied at the Hildesheim Literature Institute and, in addition to writing, also runs creative writing courses and workshops. Her debut novel *Milk Teeth*, for which she was nominated for various awards, was published in 2019. The novel has been translated into French and English and a film adaptation is in the works.

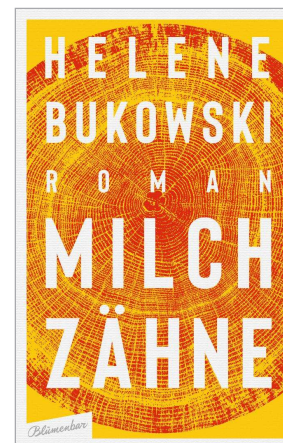

Paris, 1937. Hundreds of thousands of people follow the coffin of a young woman: Anna Seghers, Egon Erwin Kisch, Pablo Neruda and many others have come to protest against fascism, which cost Gerda Taro her life during the Spanish Civil War.

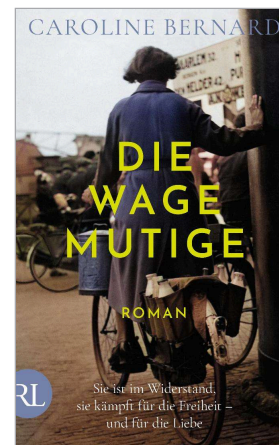
A few years earlier, the charismatic Gerda wishes to become a photographer. She is young, self-confident, full of enthusiasm and has a clear goal in life: she wants to use her images to say something about the world. But it is 1935, and nobody trusts a woman to handle a camera, let alone take photos that shed light on the political situation in Europe. Except for the photographer and Jewish emigrant Robert Capa, who recognizes Gerda's special talent and falls head over heels in love with her. The two become passionate lovers who inspire each other in their work. But when they go to Spain to report on the war against fascism, the moment comes when Gerda decides in favor of a motif and against private happiness.

With empathy and great sensitivity, bestselling author Caroline Bernard tells the story of a great love and a fascinating chapter in photo reportage.

Caroline Bernard is the pseudonym of Tania Schlie, a literary scholar who has worked as a freelance author and editor for twenty years. She has previously published eleven novels and about as many non-fiction books on cultural-historical topics. She loves coming up with stories about strong women. Her most successful book *Frida Kahlo and the Colours of Life* topped the bestsellers list for months and was translated into 22 languages.

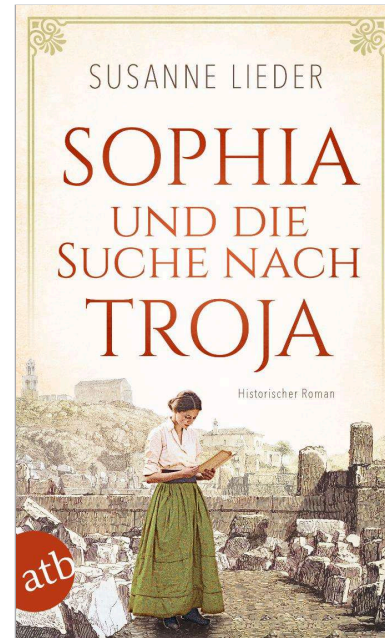

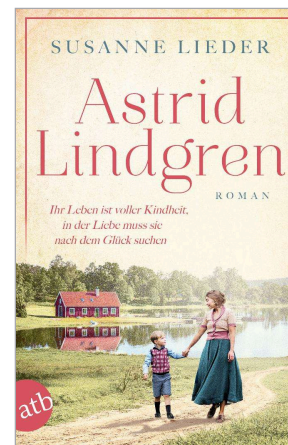

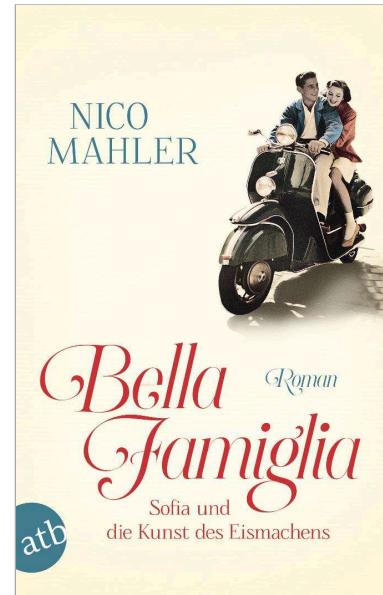

After many years in management positions in the publishing industry, she is now a freelance author and author coach. 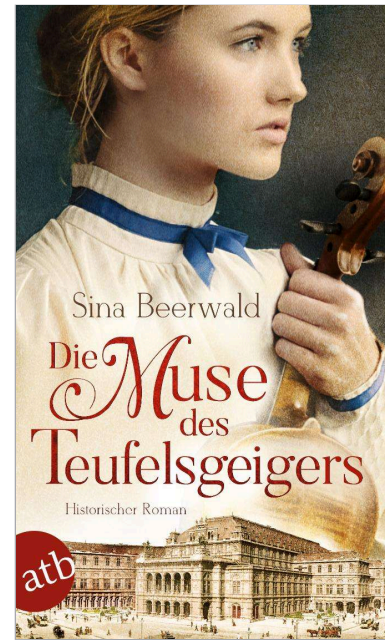

Sophie von Sawicki has mastered the craft of violin making like no other. Since her husband became addicted to alcohol, she has taken on all repair jobs herself – in secret, of course, because running a violin workshop as a woman is not allowed in early 19th century Vienna. She looks after her two children on the side. But then misfortune befalls the family: Paul von Sawicki has amassed huge debts. The only thing that can save them now is a lucrative commission. And suddenly the infamous violin virtuoso Niccolò Paganini appears in front of her workshop. His beloved Guarneri del Gesù needs to be repaired; he urgently needs it for a concert the next day, which has brought the whole city into a frenzy. The Italian is surrounded by rumors that he has made a deal with the devil, so incredible are his playing skills. Sophie, however, recognizes much more in him than a virtuoso – and feels so attracted to the supposed devil's violinist that she cannot resist ...

Sina Beerwald, born in Stuttgart in 1977, has made a name for herself with over twenty successful books to date. She has won the NordMordAward and the Samiel Award, and several of her titles have been shortlisted for the LovelyBooks Community Award, the biggest German-language readers' prize. In 2008, she moved to the island of Sylt with two suitcases and lots of ideas stowed in her luggage.

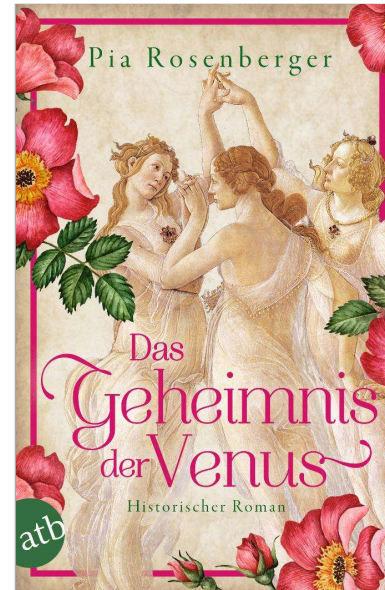

She also assists the painter Sandro Botticelli with his new painting, *Primavera*: Mira is tasked with drawing sketches of 190 plants and flowers. While working on the painting, she meets the guardsman Riccardo, who makes her heart beat faster against her will – as Mira is meant to marry a cousin of Lorenzo de Medici.

But it is not just love that puzzles Mira: when not only Gianna, the model for "Flora," disappears, but also one of the three Graces is found dead, suddenly all those involved in Botticelli's painting seem to be in danger. However, Mira has no idea that the secret behind this conspiracy leads back to her own unknown origins ...

Pia Rosenberger was born near Osnabrück and completed an apprenticeship in hand weaving before going on to study art history, literature and educational science. She has lived with her family in Esslingen for over 20 years and works as an author, journalist, museum educator and city guide. Aufbau Taschenbuch has already published her novels *The Sculptress* (rights sold to Italy and Hungary) and *The Women's Artist* (rights sold to Italy).

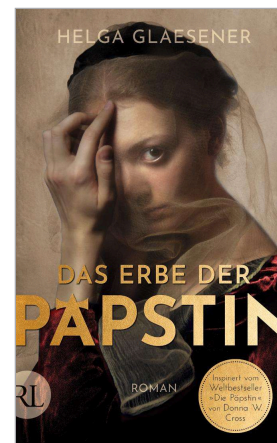

As if the car wasn't already full enough, Matthew Brady, Peter's best friend, joins the search party. Of all people, the slick, career-oriented – and way too attractive – lawyer, who wears a suit all day and is an eternal show-off!
